### HOW NCI RECEIVES ITS FUNDING



### STEP 1

The White House Office of Management & Budget (OMB) coordinates with federal agencies to formulate the President's Budget, which covers all federal agencies, including the National Cancer Institute (NCI) and National Institutes of Health (NIH), and reflects the President's priorities. The President submits the budget to Congress, which must pass appropriations legislation that funds federal agencies.

### STEP 3

The appropriations committees finalize their legislative proposals, and the House and Senate consider the proposed legislation. Once passed and reconciled into a unified bill, Congress sends the legislation to the President.



### STEP 4

The President signs the appropriations bill into law, making funds available to executive agencies, including NCI and NIH.

### **NCI Professional Judgment Authority**

The National Cancer Act of 1971 gives the NCI Director special authority to submit an annual professional judgment budget directly to the President for review and delivery to Congress. This budget reflects NCI cancer research priorities and identifies areas of potential investment in cancer research.

# Hill leaders announce deal to unlock final spending bills

Stopgap measure readied to avoid shutdown while full-year bills are being written

# Congress strikes deal to avert a partial government shutdown — for now

Both parties have reached a deal to fund part of the government and agreed to extend the current deadlines to March 8 and March 22. They still have to get it through Congress.

- Last week, shutdown averted, two "new" CR deadlines
- March 8: Ag-FDA, Energy-Water, Military Construction-VA, Transportation-HUD, Interior-Environment, Commerce-Justice-Science
- March 22: Labor-HHS (includes NIH/NCI), DOD,
   Homeland Security, Financial Services, State-Foreign
   Operations, Legislative Branch

### **FY2024 Appropriations**

### June 2023 – Fiscal Responsibility Act (FRA) enacted

- Suspended the debt limit until 2025
- Set budget caps for FY2024 (flat, except for + 3% for defense as requested in the President's Budget) and FY2025 (+1%)
- Includes a penalty ("stick") to incentivize completion
  - If any of the 12 spending bills are not completed by April 30, a 1% cut will be applied to defense and non-defense discretionary funding (sequester)
  - Some programs are exempt from sequester (e.g., VA) increasing burden for others
  - OMB implements sequester
