


- Former member of the House (12 terms, 1993-2017) Ways & Means



President Biden Announces American Rescue Plan

JANUARY 20, 2021 • LEGISLATION

- \$1.9 Trillion package, including extending unemployment benefits, housing and food assistance programs, and individual stimulus checks
- Legislation drafted in 9 **authorizing** committees
- Released on Day 1 with a March 14th deadline in mind, as current unemployment benefits are set to expire


Vice President Kamala Harris casts two tiebreaking votes to advance the budget resolution

Pelosi can afford few defections as House lawmakers prime for a second vote; progressives have signaled support

CONGRESS

Senate sets new mark for longest recorded vote thanks to vote-a-rama 2021



- Record-setting 'vote-a-rama'
- 12-hour delay for final negotiations with Sen. Joe Manchin of West Virginia over unemployment payments
- Final Senate passage shortly after noon on March 6th
- Vote of 50-49 along party lines (with Sen. Dan Sullivan of Alaska home for a family funeral)

American Rescue Plan Act of 2021

- \$92B in funding directed toward HHS to fight COVID-19 through an increase in testing, support for vaccine production and distribution, treatment, and prevention
 - Activities span HHS, including specific efforts at CDC and FDA no new funding directed to NIH
 - \$150M to NIST and \$600M to NSF to support COVID-related research
- Economic relief to Americans through:
 - Stimulus payments and increased unemployment insurance benefits
 - Aid to local, state, territorial, and tribal governments
 - Small business assistance, among other provisions
- Prioritizes return to in-person learning, provides additional funds to help schools reopen safely

Lost Productivity/Restart Costs

<u>**Research Investment to Spark the Economy (RISE) Act</u></u> - authorizes nearly \$25 billion in support to U.S. researchers who have been impacted by the pandemic; \$10B authorization for NIH</u>**

- Sens. Edward Markey (D-MA), Tom Tillis (R-NC), Gary Peters (D-MI), Susan Collins (R-ME)
- Reps. Diane DeGette (D-CO), Fred Upton (R-MI), Eddie Bernice Johnson (D-TX), Anna Eshoo (D-CA), and Anthony Gonzales (R-OH), 118 co-sponsors

- Efforts in the 116th Congress
 - HEROES Act (\$3B for NIH) did not become law
 - FY21 House Appropriations bill \$5B for NIH "for offsetting the costs related to reductions in lab productivity resulting from the coronavirus pandemic or public health measures related to the coronavirus pandemic" – not in final appropriation

- Expiration of debt limit suspension on July 31
