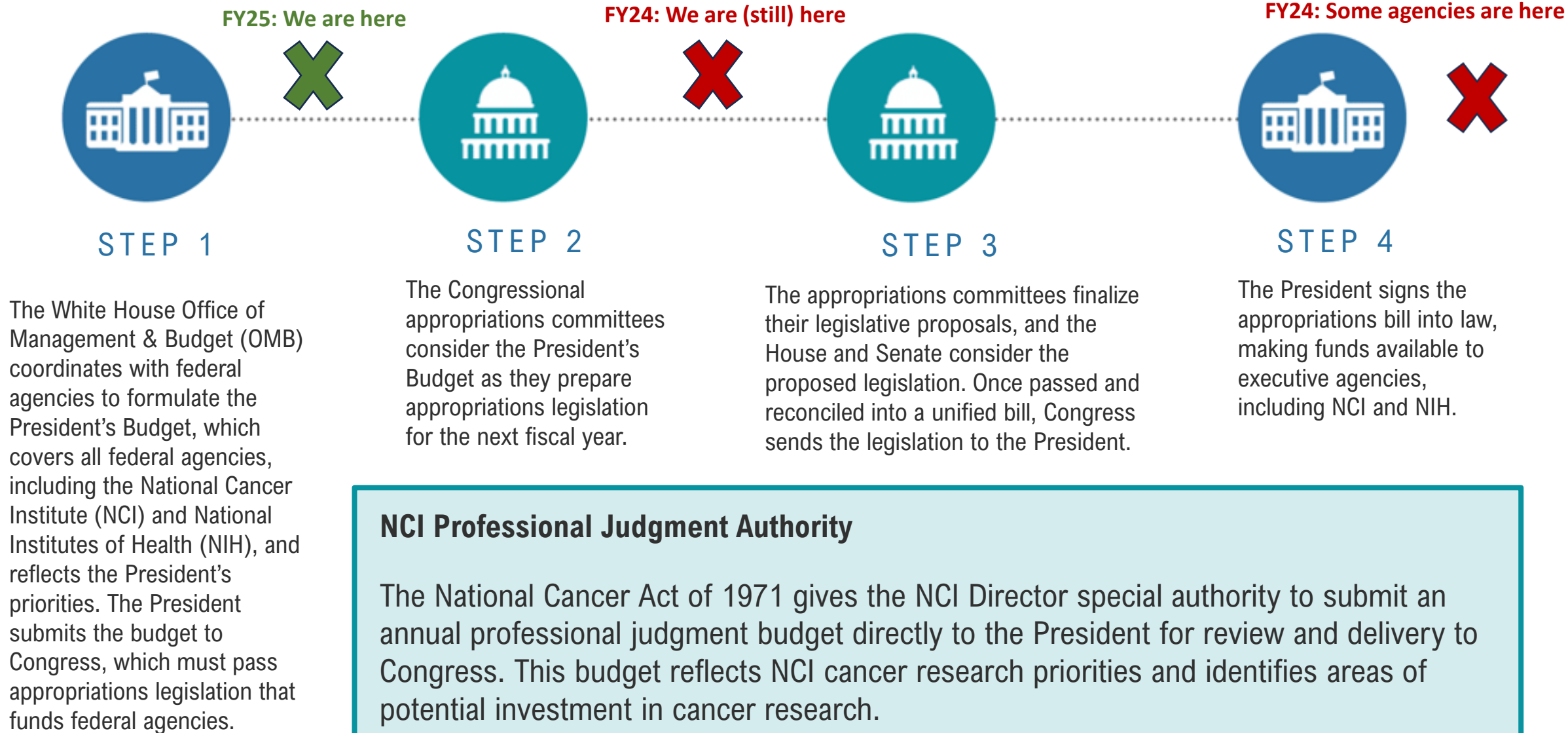

On Saturday March 9, President Biden signed half of the FY24 appropriations bills into law

The bad news:

We are in the other half

FY24 Appropriations Bills Signed Into Law on March 9

- ✓ Agriculture, Rural Development, FDA, and Related Agencies
- ✓ Energy and Water Development
- ✓ Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies
- ✓ Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies
- ✓ Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies*
- ✓ Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies*

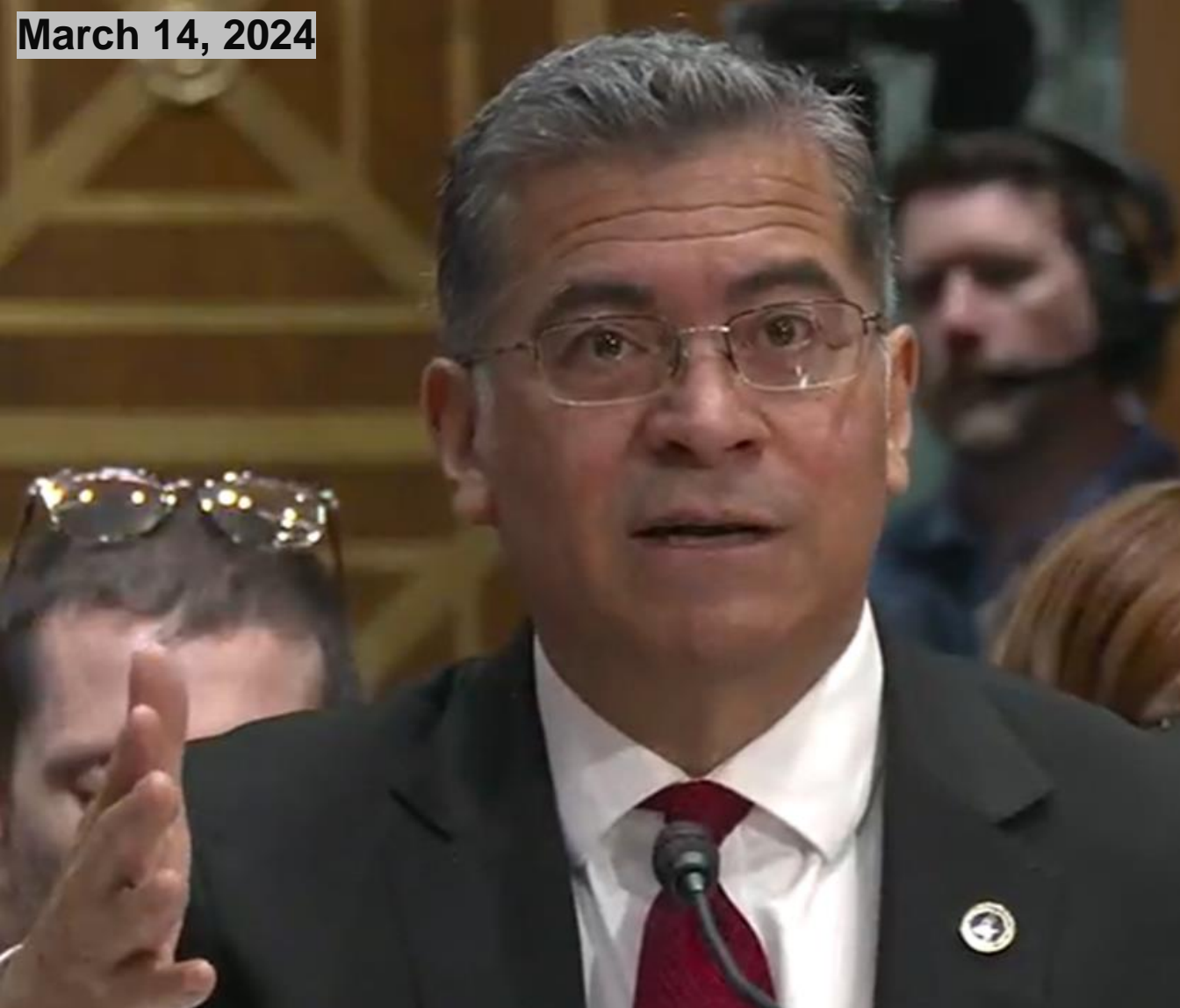



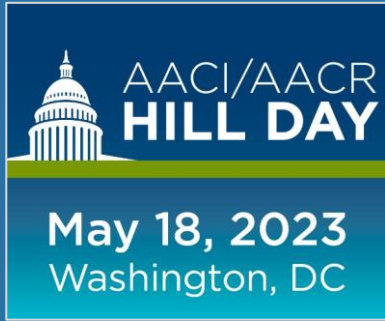
