CCITLA Program Announcement

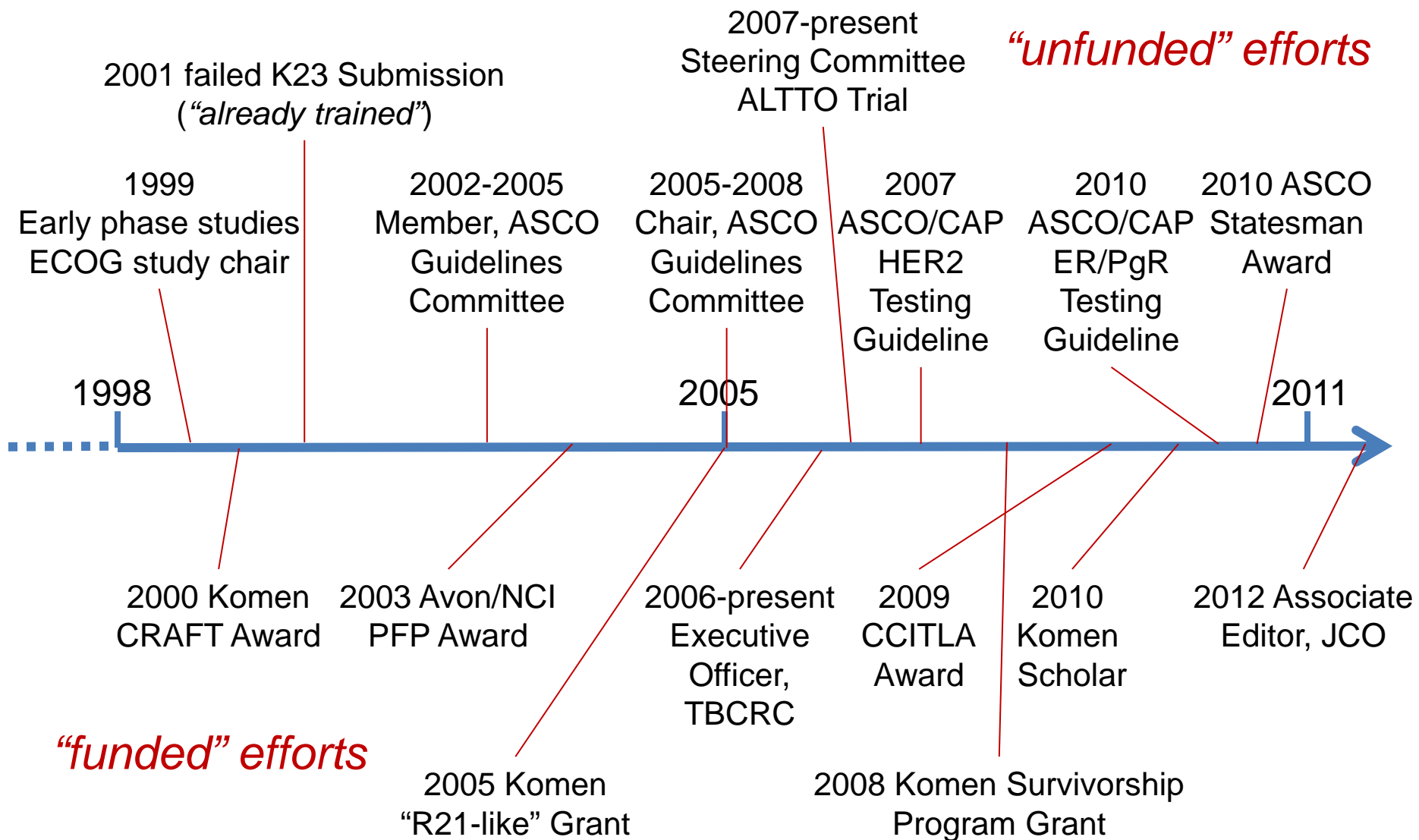
June 2009

- An NCI initiative
 - *“... to support, acknowledge, and recognize outstanding clinical investigators whose participation and activities promote successful clinical research programs and to promote retention of clinical investigators in an academic career in clinical research. It is the intent ... to support mid-level clinical investigators at NCI-designated Cancer Centers who are not currently holding Principal Investigator status on an NIH grant, but are participating extensively in NCI-funded collaborative clinical trials.”*
