



Exciting advances – recent highlights

Scientists discover a single type of Fusobacterium nucleatum that may fuel colorectal cancer (implications for prevention and screening)	NCI-funded
Scientists create AI tool that predicts response to immunotherapy ("LORIS")	Led by NCI, in partnership with MSKCC
Urine test identifies high-risk prostate cancers, may help avoid unnecessary biopsies	Funded partly by NIH/NCI (R35, U01)
Study suggests childhood cancer survivors may age faster	Led by NCI researchers NCI U01 (St. Jude Lifetime Cohort)
CISNET study informs new USPSTF breast cancer screening recommendation	Collaborative effort of 6 teams from NCI-funded Cancer Intervention and Surveillance Network (CISNET)
