President's Budget – Announced Feb.

- •NIH \$ 28.6B
- •NCI \$ 4.75B

House – Passed by Committee June 13

- •NIH \$ 28.3B
- •NCI \$ 4.75B

Senate – Passed by Committee, July 20

- •NIH \$ 28.6B
- •NCI \$ 4.99B

Appropriations Where Are We Now?

- •Fiscal Year 2006 ended Sept. 30
- Continuing Resolutions (CRs) passedSept. 29 and Nov. 17
 - NCI funded at 2006 level
 - Current CR expires Dec. 8

Appropriations – What's Next?

Congress returns on December 5 – what will happen then?

- •Pass individual bills? Not enough time
- •Include Labor, HHS in Omnibus? Unlikely
- Another CR? Probably
