The 6th meeting of the NCI Director=s Consumer Liaison Group (DCLG) was convened at 2:30 p.m. on Wednesday July 21, 2000. Thursday June 1, 2000 as a teleconference. The teleconference was open to the public. Mr. Michael Katz presided as Chair.

CALL TO ORDER AND OPENING REMARKS

The meeting was called to order by the chair, Mr. Michael Katz. The purpose of the teleconference is to bring the DCLG members up-to-date on the activities of each working groups.

REPORTS OF THE DCLG WORKING GROUPS

DCLG Operations. Ms. Ruth Lin reported that she had review the proposed orientation sent by Ms. Lee. She also addressed the issue of who would be responsible for writing the DCLG Annual Report. The DCLG members agreed that Ms. Lee will provide an outline and after it is approved, a science writer will prepare the report. She noted, DCLG orientation package is under revision. Ms. Ruth Lin will review the package and report back to Ms. Lee by Monday, July 24. Ms. Lee announced that new DCLG members have been selected but have not been announced.

NCI Website. Mr. Michael Katz reported no new developments with the NCI Web site.

Advocacy Involvement. Dr. Brad Zebrack, Ms. Kristie Dionne and Dr. Yvonne Andejeski outlined the activities to date. The NCI staff interviews are almost complete. Initially the Advocacy Involvement Working Group was planning to interview advocates who have participated in NCI activities. Since this is a very time consuming project, the DCLG members agreed to OLA=s assistance. OLA will arrange the calls. OLA staff, (along with DCLG members who would like to participate) will conduct the interviews. Dr. Andejeski requested that the DCLG provide OLA with the names of advocates (with prior NCI experience) who they would like us to interview. As these interviews are scheduled, OLA will alert the DCLG members and provide instructions on how they may participate. Once established, the questionnaire will be placed on the advocate listserv. Advocates would receive an invitation letter informing them about the listserv and/or alternative ways to communicate.

Dr. Zebrack then turned his attention to the listserv. The proposed listserv for cancer advocates would:

- Be set up on the Association of Cancer Online Resource (ACOR) site, a non profit organization for free cancer communication., or hosted by NCI.
- **\$** Be monitored by a group of DCLG members working as private citizens. Monitoring would consist of review of daily messages, setting up archives, and searchers for keywords.
- \$ Have listserv owners who would establish policies and procedures for participation on the listserv.

Discussion and Questions. In response to Dr. Zebrack=s suggestions, there were concerns about using the listserv as the mechanism for advocate interviews because of the time required (see above). Dr. Zebrack will complete a draft invitation letter within two weeks for distribution and comment by the DCLG. OLA will provide a list of advocates who have been involved in NCI activities and who will receive the invitation letter.

After a discussion regarding the concerns if hosted by NCI, the DCLG=s initial decision was to use the ACOR site.

September 2000 Meeting. Dr. Yvonne Andejeski proposed a workshop for September 21-22, 2000. The purpose of the meeting is to share information about involving advocated with organizations such as the Komen Foundation, Food and Drug Administration, Department of Defense, American Cancer Society, NCI programs and Cancer Cooperative Groups. These groups include consumer advocates in their scientific decision making processes.

Discussion and Questions. Members of the DCLG requested more information about the September meeting, including goals and outcomes. Dr. Andejeski said she will provide more details in a letter next week. Dr. Zebrack also shared his vision of a future meeting with advocates from around the country and NCI to discuss and respond to the needs of the community.

Quality Cancer Care and Health Disparities. Dr. Felicia Hodge and Ms. Gena Love

commented on the Cancer Control Academy held July 17-18 in Bethesda, MD. The Academy addressed several important issues about special populations and the underserved. Dr. Hodge strongly believes that the goal of research and its application to special population communities has not been reached. Dr. Maureen Wilson requested the help of DCLG members as the Presidents Cancer Panel continues its series of meetings on health disparities. The PCP is holding town hall meetings around the U.S. to get the input of people who are not usually heard.

DCLG members were invited to contribute questions, identify local advocates who would make presentations to the PCP, and observe as ad hoc members of the panel at these meeting.

NCI Brand. The brand campaign is proceeding. A contractor is conducting interviews on how the NCI is perceived in the community.

Communications Extraordinary Opportunity. Mr. Michael Katz reported that there was no new information since the last DCLG meeting.

Clinical Trials Promotion. Ms. Susan Butler announced that she will meet with the Cancer Leadership Council to get their viewpoint about clinical trials promotion.

Ms. Jane Reese-Coulbourne said that she will report on the finding of the pilot project at the next DCLG meeting. The clinical trials pilot project is nearing completion. A self-study module is being developed. The materials developed for the program will serve as a basic clinical trial education for the patient community. The book should be ready in October. The DCLG will be helping with promotion of the program .The DCLG can then proceed with a plan and develop appropriate messages.

Discussion and Next Steps. The next DCLG teleconference meeting will be held in early September.

- C The DCLG members suggested that the DCLG act as advocacy advisors as NCI-s new initiatives are developed and implemented.
- C Dr. Maureen Wilson requested the help of DCLG members as the Presidents Cancer Panel continues its series of meetings on health disparities. The PCP is holding town hall meetings around the U.S. to get the input of people who are not usually heard. The DCLG members are invited to attend the meetings, suggest speakers, and local advocates who will participate in the town meetings.

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
